Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) eFiling

Dear Valued Macy's Inc. Vendor,

The CPSC eFiling program is the CPSC's initiative to enable importers of regulated consumer products to file certain data from Certificates of Conformity (COC) electronically with Customs and Border Protection (CBP). This is not merely emailing existing COCs to the CPSC or CBP but digitizing individual data elements of the COC either directly into CBP's Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) or through CPSC's Product Registry.

Examples of some products requiring a Certificate of Compliance include (but are not limited to) children's products, toys, magnets, products containing button-cell or coin batteries, mattresses, mattress pads, carpets, rugs, upholstered furniture, wearing apparel, clothing storage units, bicycles, and bicycle helmets. This list of products requiring COCs may expand over time, so it's critical to review the most up-to-date requirements.

The eFiling program is currently in a voluntary pilot program. The CPSC published the Final Rule, on January 8, 2025.

The Final Rule effective date is July 8, 2026, for all CPSC regulated products and January 8, 2027, for products entered from a Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) and subsequently entered for consumption or warehousing.

To ensure compliance and the seamless import of goods, and to reduce holds at port, minimize targeted shipments, and reduced costs it is critical that importers become familiar with this fast-approaching requirement.

Additionally, vendors should review their current COCs to ensure they meet the mandatory data element requirements for eFiling, including detailed product descriptions and responsible party information.
